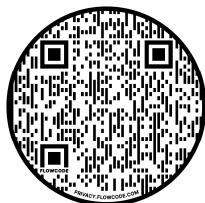

Our Mission Statement

St. Mary Parish prepares and sustains its members and guests for a life and eternity in the presence of God. In accomplishing our mission, we proclaim and celebrate our salvation through Jesus Christ enlivened by the Holy Spirit, nourish our sacramental life especially in the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, and demonstrate our faith worshipping, educating, serving and encouraging vocations.

St. Joseph and Father's Day

A college professor of mine used to joke that he always felt bad for St. Joseph. Being married to the Immaculate Conception and raising the Son of God, anytime anything went wrong in that house, you had to know who was to blame. He never had a chance at getting away with anything!

We really don't know too much about St. Joseph, but the little we do know paints a great picture of who this man was and why God chose him to be His Son's father on earth.

St. Joseph was a carpenter of humble means; he was not wealthy. We see proof of this in Scripture, when he took the infant Jesus to the temple to be circumcised and Mary to be purified. He offered 2 turtledoves or a pair of pigeons (*Luke 2:24*), considered a lesser sacrifice for those who could not afford a lamb. Despite his modest work and means, Joseph came from a royal lineage. The Gospels of Luke and Matthew both make note of his descent from David, the greatest king of Israel; and the angel who appears to Joseph to tell him about Jesus greets him with the royal title "son of David" (*Matthew 1:1-16 and Luke 3:23-38*).

We know that St. Joseph was a kind and compassionate man. When he found out that Mary was pregnant after they had been betrothed, he knew the child was not his. He also knew that women accused of adultery could be stoned to death. Not wanting that to happen to Mary, he decided to take her away quietly so not to expose her to shame and punishment. When an angel came to him in a dream, explaining that the child had been conceived through the Holy Spirit, he did as the angel instructed him and took Mary as his wife (*Matthew 1:19-25*).

When the angel appeared to him again, after Jesus had been born, to tell him that they were in danger, he immediately packed his little family up and fled to a foreign country. He remained in Egypt until the angel told him it was safe to go back, never questioning or doubting God (*Matthew 2:13-23*).

St. Joseph is a true model of fatherhood and holiness, which is why he is known to us as the patron saint of fathers and the universal Church. On this Father's Day, in the Year of St. Joseph, we pray that all of the dads out there will look to Joseph as the perfect model of fatherhood. May his silent strength and faith guide and inspire you in leading your families to God.

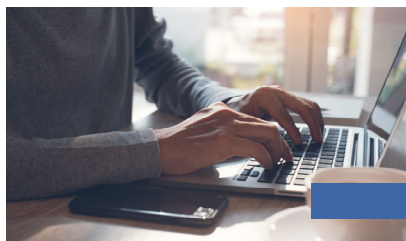



Why is it Important to Register in Your Parish?

It offers a sense of belonging and identity in a parish community and is a commitment to practice your faith.

It enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.

Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so that parish- es provide you timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will also receive a year-end

statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address or phone number.

Registered active members are eligible for sponsor/ godparent validation.

Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.

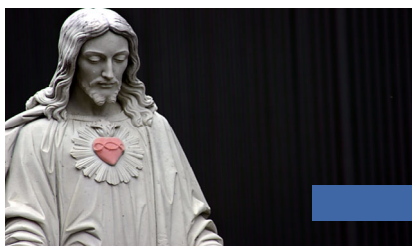
TNT Fireworks Booth

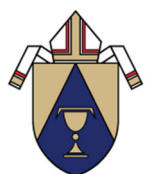


Bible Study
