## Parish Notices

### Covid Update

Given the indication of the Prime Minister to move to Step 4 on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> July, Fr Gary has now issued an e-newsletter, setting out what that will mean and how it will be managed over the coming weeks. That is also available on the parish website. We await full guidance from the Church of England which is now not expected until sometime this week, which may further modify that advice.

The strong advice is to be cautious. Rates of Covid infection in Harrogate continue rise. Hospital admissions, ICU occupancy and fatality figures remain relatively low, but are rising, albeit more slowly than in previous waves. They are 'lagging' indicators, so we won't know if they will rise significantly, for another week or two.

Please be especially, cautious if you have not had both vaccine doses, or have been advised by your doctor that you are at greater risk (for example, if having chemotherapy). Please keep following the protocols in place.
